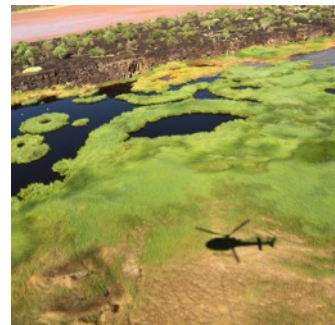
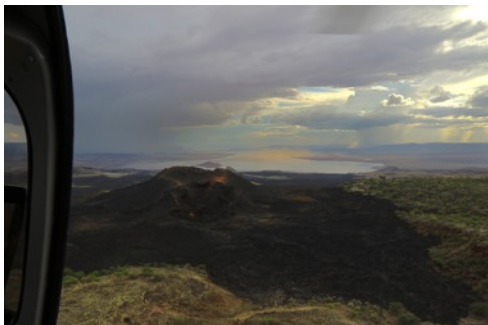

Explore by Helicopter



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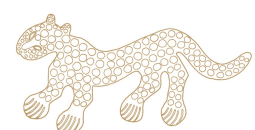
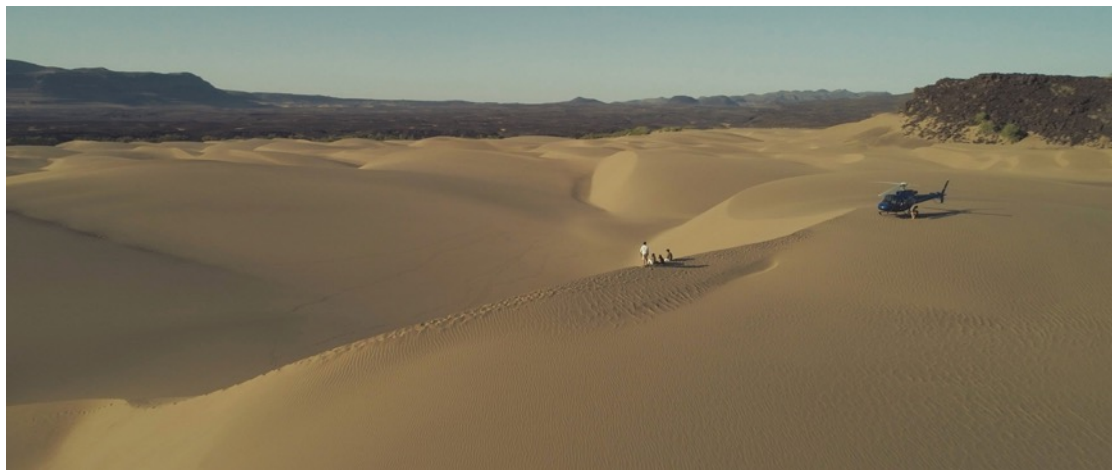


While on safari it is great fun to broaden your experience by using a helicopter to explore areas off the beaten track. These trips always follow the most scenic routes and touch down wherever possible.

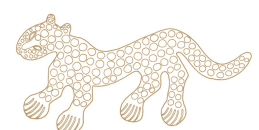

It is mostly desert, but out of these deserts rise the most fabulous mountains that are capped by granite outcrops and mysterious forests. The helicopter gives you access to these amazing spots. Often we can land at nearby Samburu villages to meet people that are way off the beaten track.



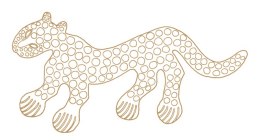
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For an even greater adventure we can fly up the Great Rift Valley to Lake Logipi with its remarkable flamingoes, land to touch the petroglyphs of hundreds of running giraffe chipped into the basalt by an artist thousands of years ago, or we could fish in the moonscape of Lake Turkana.

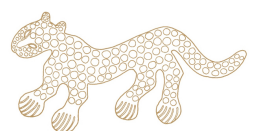
